< Remarks for Evaluation >

- Evaluation should be made on an absolute basis (rather than in comparison with the other team).
- Please mark the score and also write the score clearly for each item. You may award half-points, such as giving a score of 2.5 or 3.5 for an item.
- In evaluating the team's performance, take into consideration the composition of the team (i.e., whether it is composed of undergraduate students or graduate students or persons with legal practice experience). If the team's performance meets the judge's expectations for a team of that level, a score of 3 should be awarded. (If it exceeds that level, the scores should be 4; if it greatly exceeds it, 5; if it falls below that level, 2; and if it falls far below that level, 1)
- Please remember that "3: Good" is for average performance, in other words, 3 is the baseline.  
If the team includes members with experience in business or legal practice, please hold the team to a higher standard.
- Evaluation should be made by each judges independently. However, to ensure accuracy and fairness, we ask the judges to share their views on the scores with each other prior to submitting the evaluation sheets.
